Minutes of June 5, 2018
Regular Meeting

1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on June 5, 2018 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Ruth Robinson, Dale Roberts and Robert Davis. Others in attendance 6 members of the public and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

2.0 Executive Session None

3.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar With no changes to the Agenda, Ruth Robinson moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to approve the May 1, 2018 Regular Meeting Minutes with the correction of naming Sid Robinson as the person spraying weeds at the School, MCU. Dale Roberts moved, Ruth Robinson 2nd to approve the May 14, 2018 Special Meeting Minutes, MCU. Ruth Robinson moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to approve the May 17, 2018 Budget Meeting Minutes, MCU. Ruth Robinson moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to approve the May Invoices, MCU.

4.0 Business

4.1 Mosquito Festival It was reported that Mr. Horvath has obtained a band for Saturday night of the Festival and is seeking permission from SVE to hang the banner over the road. He is still looking for volunteers for that weekend. He will be in Paisley this week or next and would like to meet with Council and Community Members. It was requested that Mr. Horvath post on the “For Sale in Paisley” Facebook site the day before he sprays. There are a lot of complaints of mosquitos but Edward had warned that it would be a learning process as the previous years of spraying with malathion may have caused the mosquitos to develop an immunity to other sprays. Council was also asked if they had vetted Mr. Horvath and was if they were receiving reports from him. The Community member would also like to know what he’s spraying. Councilwoman Ruth Robinson will contact Edward.

4.2 Duane Young’s Retirement Ruth Robinson moved, Robert Davis 2nd to have a party July 6th honoring Duane, MCU. The party will be potluck with Council buying desserts.

4.3 Burn Permit Ordinance Ruth Robinson moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to approve a \$10.00 fee for burn permits. MCU. The permits are only needed during “Extreme” fire conditions as determined by the Forest Service. The money from the fees will be used by the Paisley Volunteer

Fire Department for paper and other such expenses. The PVFD is also proposing a membership drive with minimum fees of \$50.00 annually to \$200.00 annually dependent upon need. The membership is for property owners outside of City limits. In the event of a fire at your home or a wildland fire around your home the membership allows the PVFD to bill your insurance but anything not covered will be considered paid in full. **Dale Roberts moved, Ruth Robinson 2nd to accept the membership proposal from the Paisley Volunteer Fire Department, MCU.**

- 4.4 Past Due Bills** There are a few customers with past due bills, most are working to correct the issue but there are a couple that Water Superintendent Travis Way and two Council Members went to talk to. Melissa reports that she has talked to all but one of them, thus far no one has been able to reach that owner. Council reiterates that Ordinance #109 states the City has the right to turn water off unless a customer comes in and makes arrangements. This Ordinance will be in full effect from now on. **Ruth Robinson moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to not charge water/sewer fees for City owned buildings, MCU.**
- 4.5 Community Center Repairs** Mayor Ralph Paull reported to Council and Community Members that the west side of the building has been damaged. The floor on the west side also has damage from water coming in through the double doors. The insurance company came to inspect and take pictures. The floor with water damage is covered but the damage outside is not. The outside damage happened over an extended period of time. Mr. Paull also states someone needs to crawl under the building to determine if there is a reason for the settling and separation of the inner walls. A community member asked about the new heating/ac system. Ralph Paull stated the system is to be installed soon. The City has acquired \$7,100 in donations and has budgeted the excess to cover the cost. It was also mentioned that the outside women's bathroom needs painting to cover carvings in the wall.
- 4.6 Enact Resolutions to Receive State Revenue Sharing, Adopt Budget, Make Appropriations, Impose & Categorize Taxes for the 2018/2019 Budget** Robert Davis moved, Ruth Robinson 2nd to enact Resolution No. 2018-06 A to adopt the budget for fiscal year 2018-2019 in the total amount of \$413,959.00 and to pass an Ordinance Declaring the City's Election to Receive State Revenues for fiscal year 2018-2019. To make Appropriations for all funds in the amount of \$319,029.00 and total of reserve and unappropriated amounts, \$94,930.00 for a total adopted budget of \$413,959.00. To impose the ad valorem property taxes of all taxable property within the district for tax year 2018-2019 at the rate of \$1.5739 per \$1000.00 of assessed value for permanent rate tax. That the taxes imposed are hereby categorized for purposes of Article XI section 11b as: Subject to the General Government Limitation - \$1.5739 / \$1000.00. MCU.

5.0 Reports / Correspondence

5.1 Travis Way, Water Superintendent Travis reported there was a bad sewer plug over by Green St. Asks that a note go out with sewer bills reminding people what does NOT go into the sewer.

Lakeview Sanitation and Gary McCleese and Sons are the only other people supposed to have access to the lagoon. About 2 weeks ago someone went in and dumped irresponsibly and then hit the gate on the way out. Travis recommends a lock box with a smart code that tells who's been into the lagoon and when.

There is standing water in the area of the equipment shop and EMS building. Travis has checked it and doesn't believe there's a leak believes it's water from the ditch.

The brush hog needs repaired or replaced. The blade carriers are bent and when it dries out it will be a fire hazard.

6.0 Public Appearances Newspaper needs updated on names of Council members.

Remember to call before you dig. Any building permits need to be approved by City Council before they can go to County for approval.

Mary Lou Sanchez stated she's still interested in the property behind the Catholic Church. Ralph Paull said he was sorry, but at this time Council is not interested in selling.
