Minutes of December 5, 2017
Regular Meeting

1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on December 5, 2017 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Dale Roberts, Ruth Robinson, Kim Way and Robert Davis. Others in attendance, Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

2.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar Dale Roberts moved, Ruth Robinson 2nd to approve the December 5, 2017 Agenda and the November 8, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes. After asking for clarification on checks written to VIPs (Mosquito Festival BBQ) and the Fire Department classification check written to the Chewaucan Garage (cost of shirts and hoodies for fundraiser), Kimberly Way moved, Ruth Robinson 2nd to approve the November Invoices, MCU.

4.0 Business

4.1 Superintendent Job Description and Work Session Discussion occurred on the suggestions and additions for the Superintendent Job Description along with the feasibility of paying a part time worker. Council decided when Duane Young is ready to retire the person taking his place will be given the option of doing the lawn care, spraying and snow removal, hence hoping to pay one person rather than several. **Ruth Robinson moved, Kimberly Way 2nd to adopt the Superintendent Job Description and to post the job after Duane Young has deemed he's ready to retire. MCU.**

4.2 Elect President of Council Robert Davis nominated Dale Roberts for President of Paisley City Council, Kimberly Way 2nd. After closing nominations a vote was called and each Council Member voted yes to elect Dale Roberts as President of Paisley City Council.

4.3 Water System Survey Melissa Walton has not yet received the report from the Oregon Health Authority, discussion tabled.

4.4 Nuisance Ordinance Discussion occurred as to why the original nuisance ordinance hadn't been adopted by Council and why there had been a proposed change of the wording "nuisance" to "hazard". It was suggested changing the 10 day compliance to 30 days and adding "the enforcement officer had the right to physically post notice on site and having a sheriff's officer serve notices to land owners/renters. It was also suggested adding

wording stating the two parties have 30 days to work out an agreement before the City proceeds with any formal procedures. Council is tabling the discussion till January.

6.0 Correspondence / Reports

6.1 Speed Zone After phone conference with ODOT, Paul Hauder, Paisley School Superintendent, is gathering a packet with a study of the numbers of students crossing the highway along with letters from the School and landowners in the vicinity of the proposed zone change area showing support of changing the Zoning to a School Zone and giving permission to use their land for the new signage. Once complete this will be forwarded to ODOT as soon as possible.

6.2 Community Center Heating Unit Ralph Paull spoke to Brad Kresge with Surprise Valley Electrification concerning buying a new heating system for the Community Center. Mr. Kresge will be at the Center on Thursday to look over the existing system and to gather information.
