

**City of Paisley**  
**Minutes of July 13, 2021**  
**Regular Council Meeting**

- 1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance** The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on July 13, 2021 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Craig DeLarm called the meeting to order at 1:34 pm. Council Members in attendance were Craig DeLarm, Travis Way, Krissy Funk, Toni Bailie and Ruth Robinson (late arrival). Others in attendance: Collette Broadfoot, Amy Davis and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.
- 2.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar** Krissy Funk moved, Travis Way 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve the July 13, 2021 Agenda, the June 22, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes, the June 29, 2021 Budget Hearing, Public Hearing and Special Meeting Minutes, and the July 6, 2021 Work Session Meeting Minutes, MCU. Toni Bailie moved, Krissy Funk 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve the June Invoices, MCU.
- 3.0 Business**
- 3.1 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis stated everyone is doing a good job with the watering restrictions. He was asked if the cemetery was watering still to which he replied no they are not. Craig spoke with Mr. Hedlund, he understands why the Cemetery Board asked not to water but would like a better explanation. There is a puddle in front of Yasmine Marx home. Travis said that puddle has come up off and on through the years. He's dug down but cannot find the source of the water.
- 3.2 Stehn Property, Variance – Lot Line Adjustment.** Anderson Engineering submitted a map with a suggested lot line adjustment which gives a 5 foot setback to the existing house. Krissy Funk moved, Toni Bailie 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve the suggested lot line adjustment, MCU.
- 3.3 Homelessness** Council discussed different aspects of the law and means of meeting the rules set forth by the State. It was suggested applying for a financial hardship with the state in order to get the “go bags” suggested. There also needs to be an area set up where displaced people can camp, where we can provide an outhouse and potable water. Kristine is going to gather more information for further discussion.
- 3.4 Mosquito Festival Update** Amy Davis showed Council the t-shirts they are working on. CIS, the insurance carrier, now wants \$1000 per usage on inflatables. Amy asked if Council would consider just renting the bounce house and slide for \$200 this year, carry the insurance for this year and then they will work to figure something different out for next year. Toni Bailie moved, Krissy Funk 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve renting the bounce house and slide this year for \$200 and to paying the \$1000 deductible for the insurance, MCU. There will also be volunteer registration forms for any volunteers overseeing children activities.

**3.5 Solar Panel Update** Craig researched the cost and said it is astronomical to install a system to run even one well; he was told 20X the cost of installing a system on one pivot.

**3.6 Set Date for Public Hearing** Tabled for now.

**3.7 Mayor's Review** Repairs for the fence someone drove through will cost \$356 at Lowe's, \$320 with Craig's discount. We will need people to help. **Toni Bailie moved, Travis Way 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve purchasing materials to fix the fence, MCU.**

The City will receive \$50,000 from the state for emergency infrastructure needs. SCOEDD is helping with the process. There is an additional \$62,000 available if needed. Dustin Withers found a trailer mounted generator that is considered a "plug n play", ready to utilize, for \$36,000. The machine may be able to run all three wells. The money awarded has to be spent specifically on the requested project; the generator; but any leftover can be used towards installation.

Craig spoke to the Commissioners concerning funding for speed signs. There is some money available and they were going to make sure this was something it could be spent on and get back to him. He founds radar signs with solar panels for \$2999 apiece.

According to the Emergency Managers Office for Lake County, they will be moving over to the Ever Bridge Alert System by September 1.

The Fremont-Winema National Forest is closed due to fire activity.

**5.0 Public Appearances** Travis asked about the alleyways. Some of the debris has been moved out of the way. There was an email shared with Council from Lora Mayea on the alleyway that connects Chewaucan Street and Green Street. She believes the section of land is an actual alleyway not a driveway. She asked about naming that one and the one that connects John Street and Mill Street. After some discussion Council tabled it for now.
