Minutes of July 2, 2019
Regular Meeting Minutes

1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on July 2, 2019 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Dale Roberts, Robert Davis, Craig DeLarm and via phone, Krissy Funk. Others in attendance: Travis Way, Joan Riha and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

3.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar Craig DeLarm moved, Robert Davis 2nd, to table the January 17, 2019 Special Meeting Minutes, and approve the June 4, 2019 Budget Hearing Minutes, the June 4, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes, the June 11, 2019 Special Meeting Minutes and the June Invoices. MCU

4.0 Business

4.1 Mayor Review Ralph spoke with Renee Patrick of ONDA concerning conflict worries with the Community and the group. Ms. Patrick explained the grazing and timber trail issues mentioned were things that happened a long time ago and they no longer have a place within the group. ONDA is going to join the Festival Parade.

Dennis Flynn, with Surprise Valley Electric, spoke with Ralph concerning the plant on the hill. Currently it would cost the plant \$0.03 more to run it than what they can sell the power for, and \$0.81 more per kilowatt. They are still in need of cold water to run it. Any power used will be in Oregon, they can't use it in California. Mr. Flynn doesn't believe there is a problem with the reinjection well but is going to check into it. He also states there would not be a rate increase. Dennis Reed is the new office manager. They hope to have the plant running in August or September.

Marie Leehman asked about placing the tent for Hancock/Flick in front of the Fabric Store. Ralph called and told her ok. Council is disappointed they are tearing the tent down Saturday rather than letting people utilize the shade that day. Ralph will talk to Mrs. Leehman and see about leaving it up. It was suggested that Three Rivers ask for a reasonable cut of proceeds for Mosquito Festival revenue.

The Mosquito Festival banner that was strung across the Highway was causing power problems so had to be taken down. It is being stored in the trailer at the garage while people are looking for another place to display it. Kristine suggested putting it on her fence.

City is working with the Fabric Store and Christmas Valley/North Lake Chamber of Commerce on purchasing 5 flags to display along the fence at the Community Center. They are digging holes and placing PVC pipes that will serve to hold the flags but also allows them to be taken down. Waiting on auger.

The Poetry Show will have 125 to 150 people and there are only 110 chairs. Need to order more.

Travis did the weed eating around the jail.

Craig found paint for the bathroom at \$32.99/gallon.

Ralph talked to the road department about the cold mix. There is a large pile behind the Silver Lake gravel pile which Travis is welcome to look at. The mix is half gravel and half cold mix. When using it you shovel it into the open hole, then heat with a dryer or hot air gun and tamp it down. Supposed to last in a pile for a little while.

EMS voted to donate \$5000 to the City but they want it to go towards the Community Center and would like an accounting of what it was used for. Jon Jones believes it has to go before their Board before it can be given out.

Ralph called Joe Villigrana of the Bagley Ditch Project, to remind him of repair work that's going to be done to Cottonwood Street. Joe has work to do on the culvert and would like to do it at the same time. He prefers August or September but Ralph said no one is certain when it will happen at this time.

ZX Corporate Office wants to extend the airport. The City has talked to ZX about coordinating on the paving projects to try and make it easier on all.

Ralph asked about the Travel Oregon Grant for a food cart. Krissy never heard back from them and the deadline passed six days after the meeting. Ralph questioned going ahead with the cart as he worries about upsetting other business owners. Council discussed days and hours of operation in order to not interfere with other businesses and it was brought up that when there had been another food cart in town, no one had lost any money as the City has been able to support two restaurants for many years. Melissa will check to find if this is an annual grant opportunity.

Ralph called Kevin Hawk, the road master, to ask about painting "25 MPH" on the asphalt on Mill Street or Highway 31. Mr. Hawk does not like the idea. Also asked about portable speed bumps but Mr. Hawk worries they would be left out and get hit with a snow plow. It was suggested sending a letter to the Sheriff's Office stating Council would like to have a deputy present.

Does Council and or the City want to honor the Carlon's by naming the basketball court or a street after them. Table till next month.

Should Council consider an Ordinance for tall grass, and if it was passed how would it be enforced? Council wonders if there can be an extra charge added to the Water/Sewer bills for the City taking care of it rather than the home owner. The question will be given to the City Lawyer.

Community members have been asking about the goat heads. They don't believe they've been sprayed and even if they've come in the last week or two were they able to catch them in time?

Paisley Volunteer Fire Department opened and tested the fire hydrants, pressure testing each one.

Travis is looking into security cameras.

- 4.2 Travis Way** While doing the testing it was discovered the hydrant in front of fire hall is not working. Travis is going to talk to Duane and get it fixed.
- 4.3 Community Center Repairs** In communications with the City Lawyer, Melissa has been told the entire bidding process for the repairs was done incorrectly and needs to be corrected. After discussion **Dale Roberts moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd to send out RFQs for the repairs, having them due July 23rd, 2019. To be opened and read during the Special Meeting that evening. MCU.**
- 4.4 2020 Small City Allotment Program** Another grant opportunity to repair City streets. Allowed to have two grants open at the same time. **Robert Davis moved, Krissy Funk 2nd to apply for the grant naming John Street on the western and eastern side of Highway 31. MCU**
- 4.5 Paisley Volunteer Fire Department, GMC Fire Truck** Bob states they would like to put this truck up for bid. It isn't needed any longer. It's a 10 speed, 318 with no tank, a bare chassis. State a single bid only, due by 4:00 pm on August 6th.
- 5.0 Adjournment** Robert Davis moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to adjourn the meeting at 8:27 pm.
