

**City of Paisley  
Minutes of April 2, 2019  
Regular Meeting**

**1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance**

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on April 2, 2019 at Paisley City Hall. President Dale Roberts called the meeting to order at 7:12 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Dale Roberts, Robert Davis, Craig DeLarm and Krissy Funk (via Messenger Video). Others in attendance: Joan Riha, Michael Koff, Travis Way, Ginger Casto, Edward and Jacob Horvath and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

**2.0 Public Appearances** Joan Riha asked about repairing potholes through town. They are part of the paving project grant that the City was awarded and that will hopefully start this year.

Michael Huff thanked the Council publicly for getting everything online and running correctly with the arsenic plant. Dale Roberts said the person responsible is Travis Way and stated he has been on top of it and has done a fantastic job.

**4.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar** Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve the March 5, 2019 Minutes and the March Invoices. MCU

**5.0 Business**

**5.1 Ginger Casto** Ms. Casto was here representing SCOEDD and is working on rural development within Lake County. She came to discuss the Brownfields Project. Paisley, Lakeview and Lake County are in coalition for a 3 year federal project. There was a \$600,000 grant available which the coalition applied for and was awarded \$300,000 for assessment and starting remediation. Another \$300,000 more for hazardous material. There are 5 sites within the County that are/were being assessed in Phase I of the project. Phase II determines the actions that need to take place. 4 of the 5 sites in Lake County have moved on to Phase II. The committee is hopeful the Phase II assessments will be completed this fall.

**5.2 Mayor's Review** Mayor Ralph Paull was unable to attend. In his stead President Dale Roberts relayed to the Council that Melissa had been told the bidding for the siding on the Community Center had been done incorrectly and needed to be put back out for bid. **Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2<sup>nd</sup> to rebid the siding repair on the Community Center. MCU.**

**5.3 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis is going to talk to an electrician to determine the size of generator needed for running the plant. It was suggested contacting Rick Kirkendoll with Power Systems West, the government surplus yard in Salem or DRMO (military surplus) for the best prices.

- 5.4 Three Rivers Mosquito and Vector Control** Mr. Horvath states he is ready to spray, probably at the end of the month. Council suggested a map and/or walking with TRMVC the first round so that they know where the City wants them to spray. TRMVC tries to avoid areas where people don't want sprayed. One person complained to the state and Edward had to submit plans, maps, etc. He would like to meet with people and discuss their concerns for spraying and the festival. Dale Roberts said Ralph Paull liked and praised the crab feed put on by TRMVC. For the Festival they will be serving a breakfast (probably Sunday), lunch (Saturday) and a dinner (Saturday). Melissa asked Edward to please send her flyers for meetings and events as most of town's people aren't on Facebook. Council and Edward are in agreement on working to curb the negativity. Three Rivers would like to set up a meeting with the community the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of May, maybe Tuesday the 7th. It was suggested that TRMVC charge a fee to spraying private property and marking a calendar for when they plan to come over.
- 5.5 Bathroom Repair** Melissa had received a suggestion to replace/repair the bathroom walls as they are all marked, scratched and written on. Craig believes paint should cover the damage and will look into it.
- 5.6 Budget Calendar** Melissa submitted the Budget Calendar to Council. The question was asked why there are so many street lights and how much do they cost. Melissa stated she doesn't know why there are so many but knows they are a flat \$273 per month. There are a number of lights out. Need to go around and get meter number so SVE can fix them.
