

**City of Paisley**  
**Minutes of August 4, 2020**  
**Regular Meeting**

- 1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance** The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on August 4, 2020 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 2:36 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Dale Roberts (via phone), Robert Davis, Craig DeLarm and Krissy Funk. Others in attendance: Travis Way, Collette Broadfoot, Bruce Gibbons, Toni Bailie and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.
- 2.0 Executive Session** None
- 3.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar** **Craig DeLarm moved, Robert Davis 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve the August 4, 2020 Agenda, the July 21, 2020 Regular Meeting Minutes and the July Invoices, MCU.**
- 4.0 Business**
- 4.1 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis has been watching the water pumps. The output has decreased and the pumps are working hard to keep the storage full. Travis doesn't want to tell people to quit watering but worries that if we keep going as is, there could be trouble. There was discussion of having people water on odd or even days or watering at night versus during the heat of the day. **Craig DeLarm moved, Robert Davis 2<sup>nd</sup>, to ask the community to water during the hours of 7 pm to 7 am beginning immediately, MCU.**
- Travis also discussed people flying up and down Green and Blue Streets. In discussion a speed sign with a camera was brought up. Melissa will check on legalities.
- Bruce has enough material to spray 2-3 more times this season. Need to order more for beginning of next season along with traps. He believes that next year may be less expensive. He is required to do 40 hours of classes to keep his license.
- 4.2 OLCC Renewals** **Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2<sup>nd</sup>, to approve renewal of liquor licenses for Paisley Mercantile and the Pioneer Saloon, MCU.**
- 4.3 Dump Day Update** Melissa spoke with Lake County Commissioners during their morning session. They approved the Dump Day and passed a motion to give \$150.00 more for the expense. **Craig DeLarm moved, Krissy Funk 2<sup>nd</sup> to hold Paisley's "Free Dump Day" on August 15<sup>th</sup> with Councilors taking different time slots to be on hand at the dump site that day, MCU.**

- 4.4 **Hazard Complaints** The first letter has been sent on two of the complaints (same property), they have 30 days to respond. There was discussion on how to reach the landowner(s) for the other complaint.
- 4.5 **County Commissioners & Sheriff Taylor** At 3:07 pm, via teleconference Council was able to speak with Lake County Commissioners and Sheriff Taylor concerning the police presence in Paisley city limits. Mayor Paull stated he wanted to open a dialogue with Sheriff Taylor as to the speeding issues, drugs, alcohol and other problems in Paisley. He understands there is a shortage of officers but asks that as they travel to and from Lakeview and Christmas Valley, that they take a little bit of time and patrol around Paisley making their presence known. Hoping that with people knowing and understanding there may be an officer present in town at any time will work as a good deterrent to present bad behavior. Sheriff Taylor stated there have been officers patrolling on the out skirts but he will ask his officers to drive through town when able. He also stated that during 2019 they had received 14,000 calls. In April 2020 alone they received 12,000 calls. They are hoping to eventually have a deputy here or at least in the area.
- 4.6 **Metal on Community Center Building** Krissy is set to talk to someone with Ace Hardware in LaPine. She will bring the pricing to the next meeting.
- 4.7 **Custodian Bid** No bids received, will extend the bid until August 18<sup>th</sup>.
- 4.8 **Fire Truck Bid** One bid received from O'Leary Equipment for \$575.75. **Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2<sup>nd</sup>, to accept the \$575.75 bid from Dennis O'Leary for the 1973 Fire Truck, MCU.**
- 4.9 **Mayor's Review** Mayor Paull thanked Robert Davis for his efforts in getting the speed sign put up on Mill Street.

Ralph passed out quotes he received on different types of speed signs. Rob Lindsay with ODOT says if we buy the signs, they will put them up and maintain them. The quotes range from \$1000 each to \$6000 each. Council will look into means of purchasing.
