Minutes of March 5, 2019
Regular Meeting

1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on March 5, 2019 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Dale Roberts, Robert Davis, Craig DeLarm and Krissy Funk. Others in attendance: Joan Riha, Wayne Boyd and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

2.0 Swear In New Council Members & Elect Mayor and President

Recorder, Melissa Walton, swore in Krissy Funk as a new Council Member. She will serve a 2 year term.

3.0 Public Appearances Joan Riha asked about repairing potholes by the Paisley Perk and the sidewalks for the school kids. The section of roadway by the Paisley Perk is covered by the grant awarded to the City from ODOT. Still waiting to hear back on the sidewalks.

Councilman Craig DeLarm has heard numerous complaints about the dump's high pricing and varying and inconsistent hours of operation. He has tried to talk to the county numerous times about these issues and has been told not to call back. Ralph suggests attending a commissioners meeting and discussing it there.

5.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar The January 17th Special Meeting Minutes have been tabled. **Dale Roberts moved, Robert Davis 2nd to approve the March 5 Agenda, the January 8th Regular Meeting Minutes, the February 7th Meeting Notes and the January and February Invoices. MCU**

6.0 Business

6.1 Mayor's Review Mayor Ralph Paull discussed an LOC publication concerning Property Tax Reform. Legislature is considering revoking the 3% discount currently given to property owners for early payment of taxes. Trying to take that money from the counties and giving it to the state. Suggests contacting legislative leadership.

Ralph has heard that Three Rivers Mosquito and Vector Control is in the process of trying to make the Mosquito Festival its own entity. This will require its own board members which will not have to live within City limits. Members would have to pay a fee. Council was unaware this was even a consideration. Ralph has spoken to Edward a few times about informing Council of his plans. Ralph will talk to him again and set up a time to meet face to face.

Crab feed on the 30th. The City never received a flyer but Edward sent out postcards. Everyone agrees social media is not the place to advertise or complain. Not everyone is on Facebook, so different or additional advertising needs to be implemented. The complaining is very unprofessional and creates resentment.

There are a number of grants being issued throughout the County. It would be nice if the City was able to get a couple of them. Need someone whom is willing to look into grants.

- 6.2 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis was unable to attend. He spoke to Ralph about looking into a backup generator for the arsenic plant. We will get a number for Rick Kirkendall and Travis can contact him to see what he's got. Need to get it into next year's budget. Craig suggested contacting the government yard where he found the fire truck.

The Town of Lakeview has given the City of Paisley a surplus spray truck. After discussion of what to do with the old jet sprayer that blew apart **Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd to take the hose off of the old sprayer and get rid of the metal. MCU.**

- 6.3 Ruth Robinson, Paisley School, Dorm Building Permit** **Krissy Funk moved, Robert Davis 2nd to approve the building permit for remodeling at the Paisley School Dormitory. MCU.**

- 6.4 Three Rivers Mosquito and Vector Control** Council received a 2018 income and expense form from Edward Horvath. Bottom line states Income for Mosquito Control \$998.98, Cost of Mosquito Control \$8111.06, Amount Forward -\$7112.08. Working to get Edward to meet with people face to face and sit down for a conversation.

- 6.5 Truck Bids** Three bids were received, along with a note rescinding the first bid, making it two total. One for \$500 and one for \$400. **Robert Davis moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd to accept the \$500.00 bid from Rick and Gerry Wann for the 1992 Ford Ranger. MCU.**

- 6.6 Community Center, Repairs & Maintenance** The City has received one bid for the siding repairs. Ralph asked if we want to send it back out for more even though we haven't heard back from anyone else. The construction businesses are starting to get booked up for the summer. Repairs will have to wait till after the beginning of the new budget year. **Dale Roberts moved, Krissy Fund 2nd to accept the bid from Combat Construction for repairs to the siding of the Community Center, using metal instead of hardy plank, construction to start after the beginning of the new fiscal year contingent on the expense being approved within the new budget. MCU.**

There are a lot of chairs missing from the Community Center. Ralph asked Melissa to look into cost of replacing them.

The Garage, who is in charge of hauling trash for the City, has placed a dumpster at the Trailer Court replacing the trailer they've used previously. Trash bags from Community Center functions can still go to the Trailer Court dumpster but they ask that the person hauling the trash let the Garage know so that there is no question about who is using the dumpster.

6.7 Planning Melissa stated to Council that Darwin Johnson, the County Planning Director, is willing to attend City Council meetings and help out with permitting issues and questions at no cost to the City.

6.8 Oster Professional Cara Wilbur has contacted the City letting us know they are terminating the audit contract beginning the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019. In speaking with her they have acquired a very large client within Harney County that will require a lot of their time.

6.9 Water Tank Cleaning and Inspection Jason Lowry with LiquiVision out of Klamath Falls, has sent a quote for cleaning and inspection of the water tank. Melissa believes Travis might have another one from another company out of Wyoming. This item needs to be added to the budget.

7.0 Reports / Correspondence

There is an Economic Development Public Meeting March 7th beginning at 7 pm at the Community Center. Ralph has been working to get people to come and join. Believes it's good for local business owners to attend.

8.0 Adjournment Craig DeLarm moved, Robert Davis 2nd to adjourn the meeting at 8:39 p.m.
