

**City of Paisley**  
**Minutes of May 7, 2019**  
**Regular Meeting**

**1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance**

The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on May 7, 2019 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Dale Roberts, Robert Davis, Craig DeLarm and Krissy Funk. Others in attendance: Joan Riha, Travis Way, Wayne Boyd, Lynda Lown, Maggie Allen, Jessica Abell and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

**2.0 Public Appearances Craig DeLarm moved, Krissy Funk 2<sup>nd</sup> to move “Public Appearances” to the bottom of the agenda. MCU**

**3.0 Executive Session None**

**4.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar Dale Roberts moved, Craig DeLarm 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve the May 7, 2019 Agenda, the April 2, 2019 Minutes and the April Invoices. MCU. The January 17, 2019 Special Meeting Minutes were tabled.**

**5.0 Business**

**5.1 Mayor’s Review** Mayor Ralph Paull reminded everyone of the Mosquito Control and Festival Meeting on the 14<sup>th</sup> from 4 to 6 at the Community Center. He’s been asked if Edward has sprayed yet and whether the larvaciding has occurred. No one is sure what the timeline is.

**5.2 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis had Joe from High Desert come out and inspect the arsenic plant and water pumps in order to write a quote for wiring and a backup generator. He’s also talked to Rick Kirkendall, hoping to have a quote from him this week also. The generator has to be a special one to handle the pumps plus the plant. Craig said there are two large generators up at the Mill Site, he’s not sure what they are for or if they are big enough. Dustin Wither’s had given Ralph a paper for a grant for this project but the deadline to file had already passed. Ralph wonders if SVE would be able to help with this project also.

Surprise Valley is supposed to be here this week to replace the bulbs in the nine street lights that are out.

Travis asks what Council wants to do with the old jet sprayer. He wonders about fixing it up or replacing it rather than scrapping it; having it as backup for the truck received from Lakeview.

**5.3 Community Center Repairs** Melissa states she sent our three RFQ (request for quote) and received one back from Combat Construction. **Dale Roberts moved,**

**Krissy Fund 2<sup>nd</sup> to accept the bid from Combat Construction for repairs to the siding on the Community Center building as long as it was the same quote sent previously. MCU**

**5.4 Well on Lown Property** Lynda Lown wants the old well on her property capped. The well belongs to the City and she states they are responsible for the maintenance and up keep. The well has been tested and she states the tests determine the well is not viable. She also feels that it can be claimed as abandoned. She would like to see it dug down, capped and covered as the City is liable for any damages or injuries received and Lynda feels it is a danger. Dale says the well has never been cleaned out nor tested correctly. Council would like to see the water being used if it is viable. Krissy is willing to go to the Water Master and pick up any paperwork related to this well to see if it is usable in any way in the future. **Kristine Funk moved, Robert Davis 2<sup>nd</sup> to cap the well for the moment and then gather paperwork for future contemplation. MCU** After further discussion **Krissy Funk moved, Dale Roberts 2<sup>nd</sup> to have the Chewaucan Garage dig the top out, cap the pipe and cover the entire thing for \$250.00. MCU**

**5.5 Bathroom Repair** Craig looked at the walls and believes they need stripped down and primed before painting. He suggested FRP board as the cheapest, maybe \$7.00 a sheet. Krissy suggested a heavy plywood and painting with a heavy gloss paint that when written on can be sanded and repainted. It was then suggested using a bed liner paint which would help to deter writing and drawing because of the uneven surface. Going to price it out.

**5.6 Heat at the City Equipment Shop** Melissa stated the Disaster Unit, when building the new barn, had run a line from their propane tank into the equipment shop because they expected to keep the end bay. They have since moved out and the PVFD has moved a tanker truck in. The PDU have been asking the City to split their propane bill with them for the past few months. Melissa talked to Dustin and he states there is no need for heat in there as he will empty the truck during the cold months. There are three options; the situation can remain the same and the City splits the propane with the PDU, or the PDU can turn the propane off at the Equipment Shop, or the City can pay almost \$1000 to have the line fixed. The Council would like the propane turned off to the Equipment Shop.

**5.7 Backboards for the Basketball Court** A couple students from the junior class are painting lines and putting up backboards. They have found some boards for \$130 apiece and have asked Council for the cost of the boards. The students had been told at the beginning of the year to start fundraising for their projects. Council would like to see the students raise some of the money on their own. **Robert Davis moved, Krissy Funk 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve matching the money the students can raise for purchasing backboards for the basketball court. MCU.**

**6.0 Public Comment** Craig DeLarm reports he believes he has been awarded \$131,000 grant for the archery range. Money will go for targets and building complex. Scholastic

archery programs should be integrated within the schools in Paisley, North Lake and Lakeview by next year. Wants to use the land between the rodeo grounds and the ZX. Insurance will be paid by the range thru the shop or a nonprofit, with the proceeds from pay boxes for day use and donations. Should be around \$97.00/month. 1.7 million dollar coverage. The 4H Program, school and volunteers will help to maintain the facilities.

Krissy's family wants to put in the Veteran's Memorial just outside her property line. Asks for comments and suggestions. She would also like to put a building on her property to be utilized as an art gallery. Locals used to hang their art at The Homestead but that is no longer available. She will present the entire idea formally, just looking for ideas and comments.

**7.0 Reports / Correspondence** Mosquito Control & Festival Meeting May 14<sup>th</sup> 4-6. Budget Meeting May 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm, will have one May 17<sup>th</sup> if needed.

**8.0 Adjournment** Robert Davis moved, Dale Roberts 2nd to adjourn the meeting at 8:44 p.m.
