Minutes of January 7, 2020
Regular Meeting

1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on January 7, 2020 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Dale Roberts, Craig DeLarm and Krissy Funk. Others in attendance: Travis Way, Toni Bailie, Karon Paull and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.

2.0 Executive Session None

3.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar Dale Roberts moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd, to approve the January 7, 2020 Agenda, the December 3, 2019 Regular Meeting Minutes and the December Invoices. MCU

4.0 Business

4.1 Mayor's Review Dedicating the basketball court. Craig DeLarm has found an all-weather sign that would cost around \$350.00. The sign will attach to the chain link fence. He plans to do some price comparisons.

Dale Roberts moved, Kristine Funk 2nd, to put out for bid the repairs of the outer walls on the western and southern sides of the Community Center, MCU.

Past due water bills - Council wants the new water bills coming out in February to include a statement discussing Ordinance 109 and stating this Ordinance will be enforced from this point forward. They are hoping to curb past due accounts.
Craig DeLarm moved, Kristine Funk 2nd, to include a statement in January's water/sewer bills reflecting Ordinance 109 and the Council's intentions of enforcement, MCU.

Ralph asked if any other Council members were willing to be on the radio Saturday to discuss the meeting. Kristine and Craig are willing.

Floor repair – Council discussed the cost of having the floors redone and wants to have the cost of just having them cleaned and refinished rather than sanded.
Table discussion and wait for other bids.

Grants – Dale stated he has seen information on a Spire's Grant that includes generators. Would these work for Arsenic Plant?

Deer Ordinance – waiting to see what steps the County takes on this issue.

The Christmas tree outside the outer bathrooms is leaning and causing issues with the sidewalk. Not to mention all the roots sticking up within the yard. Ralph

would like to see the lights come off the tree and have it cut low and kill the stump. Mobley Tree Service was in town around Christmas and willing to do the work along with cutting down the other trees. Including grinding the stumps he would have charged \$2000.00. But the money hadn't been budgeted. Council hopes Mr. Mobley is willing to do it for the same price during the next budget year.

Repairs at the Fire Hall still need done. Council is concerned there may be more damage if not done soon. Melissa will contact CIS.

- 4.2 **Travis Way, Water Superintendent** Travis had nothing to report concerning water and sewer but did want to discuss speeding within City limits. He would like to see some police presence, especially around the School during the morning before start time. The City is willing to write a letter to the County.
- 4.3 **Mosquito Festival Update** No update.
- 4.4 **Edward Horvath** City received an invoice for \$7875.00 from Three Rivers Mosquito and Vector Control for spraying for this upcoming summer. Council discussed taking Mr. Horvath to small claims court to redeem \$5000 they feel still owed. There were numerous complaints concerning the spraying; a lot of people don't believe he ever sprayed, some state when he did come over it was very late, and there were complaints of him actually spraying people. Council wants documentation of services provided. Council wants Melissa to contact Jim Bailey, the City's lawyer, and find out where the City stands. Price comparisons of having someone come to Paisley to spray versus buying equipment and spraying ourselves needs to be done.
- 4.5 **Nuisance Ordinance** If passed, nuisance complaints will come to the City. Someone with the City will go out and take pictures then present the complaint to the Council. They will then decide on whether or not to take action and what action needs to take place. **Kristine Funk moved, Dale Roberts 2nd, to approve the Hazard Ordinance (formerly called Nuisance Ordinance).** MCU
- 4.6 **Water Master Plan, Resolution #2020-01-A**
Kristine Funk moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd, to pass Resolution #2020-01-A, Authorizing a Forgivable Loan from the Safe Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund in the amount of \$20,000.00. This money will be used to pay Anderson Engineering for a Water Master Plan for the City of Paisley. MCU
- 4.7 **Grants for Part-Time Police Officer** Kristine is still looking for grants to pay a "Resource Officer or Constable". Hoping to engage someone who's already involved in another agency but willing to spend some extra time in Paisley.
- 4.8 **Cleaning Bids** Ralph read the bids to Council and the people assembled, leaving the bidders names out of discussion. Three bids were received. One for \$130 per month, one for \$140 per month and one for \$25 per week with an additional \$50

per event. Council had questions on the lowest bid but was unable to reach the person who had submitted it. They discussed when the previous contractor was expected to return and expressed concern of having her come back to no job even though she had said to put the contract out for bid. **Kristine Funk moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd, to accept the bid for \$130.00, offering the bidder a temporary position as the cleaning contractor. MCU. Tyrell Damewood was the person awarded the contract.**

4.9 City Recorder Kristine Funk moved, Craig DeLarm 2nd, to wait to do evaluations till after or close to a year of the contract being signed. MCU
