Minutes of February 2, 2021
Regular Meeting

- 1.0 Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance** The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on February 2, 2021 at Paisley City Hall. Mayor Ralph Paull called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm. Council Members in attendance were Ralph Paull, Craig DeLarm, Ruth Robinson, Toni Bailie and Krissy Funk via phone. Others in attendance: Travis Way, Jon Muir and Melissa Walton, City Recorder.
- 2.0 Executive Session** None
- 3.0 Agenda & Consent Calendar** Craig DeLarm moved, Toni Bailie 2nd, to approve the February 2, 2021 Agenda, the January 19, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes and the January Invoices, MCU.
- 4.0 Business**
- 4.1 Mr. Muir, Community Wildlife Education** Jon Muir visited with Council about the proposed urban deer ordinance. He discussed the hazards of the animals eating man-made food; it changes the intestinal processes and the deer will eventually starve to death. He stated we can still pass an ordinance stating the wildlife are not to be fed as long as the City is willing to stand behind and enforce the ordinance and process fines, demonstrating seriousness and reliability. Many cities have tried to pass the same type of ordinance and have not been very successful. If the City does proceed with harvesting the animals the meat has to be inspected and certified before it can be given away and there has to be someone certified to process the meat in order for it to be given out through a food bank. Ralph asked Council to think about it and at the next meeting they will discuss the who, what, where and when along with enforcement; is the ordinance realistic and feasible. Ralph shared numbers he had collected over a couple weeks time period on the deer population. Travis asked to have “do not feed the deer” on the water/sewer bill.
- 4.2 Travis Way, Water Superintendent** He has discussed a new well with Nicole from Anderson Engineering, they are finishing a water master plan for Paisley. The plan will enable the City to apply for an infrastructure grant to replace and repair the existing water system lines. A new well would be part of that process. We also need to start looking into another grant for the sewer system.
- 4.3 Community Center Use Fees** Table till next meeting.
- 4.4 Cameras** Craig is going to install the cameras. He wants to make sure all four cameras, set at the four different corners of the building, can be read by the hard driver and that any holes he has to drill are filled correctly keeping bugs, rodents

and weather out of the building. **Toni Bailie moved, Ralph Paull 2nd, to allocate \$50.00 to pay someone to help in installing the cameras, MCU.**

- 4.5 Mayor's Review** Ralph discussed the FEMA meeting him, Ruth and Craig attended for alert services. The county paid \$7,200.00 for the program. Ralph asked if we had the extra funds to help out.

Ralph encouraged everyone to participate with LOC (League of Oregon Cities) and to sign up for their weekly bulletins.

Ralph wrote a testimony of support for Bill 2345, a program that supports rural communities including grant writing services.

Craig and Michael Norris have submitted the grant to People for Bikes for the pump track design.

Ralph asked if anyone has seen anything from HomeServe, Melissa said she's checking into it.

Travis and Melissa need to start looking for someone to cover for them if something happens, backup people.

Need to decide on a Christmas Tree.

Ralph talked with a gentleman named Mark Sperling with Peak Performance Contracting. He's going to be demolishing the Wafford house and rebuild. He contacted Travis about needing the water and sewer turned off and capped. The City will move forward as soon as we receive the locate notification.

- 5.0 Reports / Correspondence** Melissa reported she had received a notice from First Community Credit Union, formerly Umpqua Bank, in Lakeview. They are in possession of a safe deposit box belonging to the City. The City can remain with First Community by opening a deposit account, pay a box fee of \$50.00 annually and a key deposit of \$15.00. If we want to close the account then someone who signed the original agreement needs to sign to close the account. The original signers were Cal Young and Theresa Vickerman. After discussion **Craig DeLarm moved, Toni Bailie 2nd, to close out the old safe deposit agreement with Theresa Vickerman's signature and to purchase a fire proof safe for the City, MCU.**
